








His passion and enthusiasm becomes evident when he starts talking about his latest acquisitions. Sitting side by side in the newly painted showroom are two white Alfa's, a seemingly matching 1963 and 1967 Alfa Romeo Giulia Sprint 1.6 and a GT Veloce. While these cars were officially not produced until 1964, the 1963 model is unique in that it was a limited showroom edition, to be used to entice people to buy the new car while production was in full swing. Roberto walks us through the small differences between the cars: "take a look at the sky and velour seats", he says, while he continues by pointing out that the steering wheel has exposed aluminum in this showroom

model, and that the paneling is completely different as well. Then he pops open the hood "the '67 model does not have this", gesturing at the telescopic hood prod. And even the front and rear bumpers are different: made in one solid piece, while bumpers on the '67 are made from two separate pieces; even the Borrani wheels are slightly
